Watch "Bonhoeffer" Documentary by Martin Doblmeier *January 6 at 6 p.m.*

The release of "Bonhoeffer: Pastor. Spy. Assassin." has sparked controversy, as Dietrich Bonhoeffer's legacy as pastor and martyr has been co-opted by purveyors of Christian Nationalism. If you have

seen the movie, or are planning to see the movie, it can be helpful to have a clear sense of the facts about Bonhoeffer's life and resistance to National Socialism in the first part of the 20th century. Martin Doblmeier's documentary highlights firsthand accounts with Bonhoeffer scholars and friends and family of the Lutheran pastor. Join us on Monday, January 6, at 6 p.m. at GA for a viewing of this informative and inspiring film.


We meet about 10 times a year for one hour, currently on the second Thursday of the month at 5:00 - sometimes on Zoom and sometimes in person.

We are excited to share our 2025 Adult Education schedule. You can find that schedule on page 7 of this newsletter. We plan to share it each month in the "Gazette" as well as occasionally in the Saturday email newsletter and hope you will join us for these offerings. January is a time for fresh beginnings, and it also offers us an opportunity to reflect on how we live out

Christ's command to love one another as He has loved us. In the seasons of Advent and Christmas, we focused on the theme of incarnation through many of the readings we encountered. And just as it is important to learn about how God shows love through the person of Jesus, we too are called to show love through our own lives.

One of the ways we embody this love is through a commitment to racial justice and reconciliation. On Jan. 21, 2025, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Central time, the ELCA will feature a free online educational event that centers the voices of ELCA leaders of color as part of the National Day of Racial Healing. This nationwide event has been held since 2017 as an opportunity to bring ALL people together and inspire collective action to build common ground for a more just and equitable world.

This structure of worship, followed by learning, ending again with worship is intentional. As people of faith and part of a church that is known as the whitest denomination in the United States, this work must be grounded in our trust in a God who meets us, claims us, and calls us to love and justice. Occurring the day after MLK Day each year, this is a time when we can intentionally work toward becoming the beloved community that Dr. King strove to create through his life. Through this educational opportunity, we can begin the work of becoming that community to which we are called, and find energy for the road ahead.


We will need support in the coming winter months to keep our Community Meal vibrant and joyful! Please consider participating!


Rainbow Church Meets January 11
