2025 Annual Congregational Meeting – A Summary



The Gustavus Adolphus congregation held our annual meeting on Sunday,

January 26, following worship. The meeting was chaired by council president Jenny Arneson. After an opening prayer led by Pastor Ian Coen-Frei, we got down to the business at hand, starting with verbal reports from both Pastor Ian and Deacon Phil Holzman who outlined highlights of the past year for them in their ministries. We then recognized members of the committees and task forces who served during 2024, asking everyone to stand and be recognized.

Next on the agenda was business related to the church council. We recognized the 2024 council as follows:

Continuing the business of church council, we heard the report of the Nominating Committee who brought forth three candidates (in addition to the two named above to be nominated for another term):

The slate of nominees was elected, bringing our church council to nine members.

The 2025 Nominating and Audit Committees were appointed along with delegates to the North Minneapolis Conference Assembly in February and the Minneapolis Area Synod Assembly in May (Gary Anderson and Adrienne Bisping).

•No increase in giving: Because of the important work of the stewardship committee, we anticipate an increase in overall giving in 2025. Yet, we have chosen to be conservative, hoping for an excess rather than deficit at year's end.

•An operating reserve fund: Creating this fund in 2024 and contributing to it these next few years will ensure that we have cushion as giving trends fluctuate through the year, reducing anxiety and contributing to an experience of abundance.

•Benevolence: GA has decided to continue to be generous by maintaining our benevolence to the wider church and local organizations, even when it would be easy to cut those lines from the budget.

None of this would be possible without your faithful generosity. Whether through your financial gifts, your volunteer efforts, or your prayers, you are making a difference. I am continually blown away by the embodiment of Christlike service I witness at GA. Thank you for being part of this mission to build community with God at the Center.

As we embark on another year of ministry, let us do so with hearts full of hope and hands ready to serve. May we continue to trust in God's leading and celebrate the blessings of being in community with one another.

Thank you for your participation in this year's Annual Meeting and for all you do to make our church a thriving, welcoming place of faith. I am excited for the journey ahead and hope forward to witnessing how God will work through us in the year to come.


Rainbow Church Meets February 8

The good news is that social connection - friendship, companionship, and even cordial interactions between strangers provide a powerful antidote against the

Annual Meeting Thanks



Annual Meeting Summary, continued

We discussed more business, including policies that were updated or enacted this past year. Matt Streed gave a presentation on the progress in the Capital Appeal projects – including completed work, work in progress, and work budgeted for the future. Included in this report was approval of an expenditure of up to \$17,000 to replace the basement narthex furnace and air conditioning which has failed. It was interesting to note that this is original equipment installed when the narthex addition was built in 1992.

We then moved on to the 2025 budget, presented by treasurer Lynn Lurvey. After a slide presentation by Lynn, the congregation unanimously approved the budget as set forth by the Finance Committee and Church Council for the coming year.

Deacon Phil then offered the closing prayer and Jenny Arneson declared the meeting adjourned.
